

Robert Owen, Past Present and Future



Robert Owen (1771-1858) was a wealthy mill-owner whose experience of the barbaric effects of the Industrial Revolution on individuals, combined with inspiration from “the Enlightenment”, prompted him to become a visionary social and educational reformer. Owen put his ideas to the test in New Lanark, a Scottish mill village, where he provided an education for the community, covering pre-school to adult education in the Institute for “Formation of Character”. Subsequently, Owen took his ideas to America, attempting to establish a Community of Equality at New Harmony, Indiana (1824-1828).

The site of Owen’s original Institute for Formation of Character in New Lanark has now been designated a UNESCO World Heritage site (www.newlanark.org/world-heritage-site). The Institute for the Formation of Character also celebrates the 200th anniversary of its opening in January 2016, so it is very fitting that that the Robert Owen Centre for Educational Change invites you to visit, to explore the philosophy of Robert Owen and the legacy of his revolutionary ideas on Education and social welfare in Scotland and beyond.
